There are some definitions of speaking according to experts. Cameron states that speaking is an active use of language to express meaning. Meanwhile, McDonough and Shaw define speaking as a skill to produce utterance that is used to express ideas, opinions, wishes or desires to do something, to negotiate and solve problems, as well as to establish and maintain relationships. Thus, it can be concluded that speaking involves

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oral communication to convey feelings and information. Mastering speaking skill means acquiring both micro- and micro-skills of speaking. Speaking skills are divided into macro and micro skills by Brown. The smallest units of language, such as phonemes, morphemes, words, phrases, and collocations, are created using micro-skills, while the term "macro-skills" refers to the speaker's ability to focus on the most important aspects of speech, such as fluency, discourse, function, style, cohesion, and speaking strategy. By mastering both micro and macro skills, speakers and listeners will construct and share a sense of success. Brown says that when a person can demonstrate the ability to speak in a particular language, their language acquisition is considered successful. Therefore, teachers must create a supportive classroom environment that allows learners to develop their speaking skills.

In the speaking classroom, activities are designed to help learners produce speech sounds and sound patterns; use sentence and word stress, intonation patterns, and rhythm of the target language; choose language appropriate to circumstances, issues and social context; build ideas in a clear, logical sequence; use language to express opinions; and speak clearly and fluently.
